Appeals Court Dismisses Last Remaining 2023 Joint Employer Rule Challenge



What happened: Last week, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit dismissed a case brought by the Service Employees International Union (SEIU) alleging that the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) did not go far enough with the 2023 Joint Employer Rule.

- Why it matters: This was the last step needed to void the rule.
- **Some background:** The Restaurant Law Center (RLC) had intervened in this case with other business groups and jointly petitioned the court for the case's dismissal.

What this means: After almost two years of fighting the NLRB's 2023 Joint Employer Rule, the long-established "direct and immediate" joint employer standard will again be in place with clear and stable guidance for foodservice employers and employees.

Go deeper: This win follows a similar win in the <u>United States</u>
 <u>District Court in the Eastern District of Texas</u>, where the NLRB also withdrew an appeal of the court's decision vacating the 2023 Joint Employer Rule in its entirety as illegal.


