**The big picture:** Paid Leave benefits begin January 1, 2026. In anticipation of the rollout of the program, Hospitality Minnesota has partnered with the Office of Paid Leave for an upcoming webinar tailored to the hospitality industry.

The details: As a hospitality employer, you play an important role in helping your employees learn about and access Minnesota Paid Leave. The webinar will provide an overview of the program including how to request an exemption for certain seasonal workers, answer your questions, and help you get ready to meet your responsibilities under Paid Leave.
