



Why it matters: Health and wellness fees, service charges, resort fees, amenity fees, and more are set to go away based on the intent of the legislation.

• Yes, but: Credit card fees, mandatory gratuities (i.e. 18% on party of 6 or more or 'no tip' model restaurants), and government taxes/fees are not included in this legislation.

**The big picture:** Legislators have called for "all in pricing" across the

economy to avoid hidden fees. The bill will go into effect January 01,

2025. • What's next: Once the bill becomes law, Hospitality Minnesota will work with the Attorney General's Office and Department of Revenue






