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Our Impact Measured: ProStart Data Collection Released



NRAEF Data Collection Results for the 2023-2024 School Year

This just in! Thanks to our friends over at the National Restaurant Association Education Foundation (NRAEF), we now have amazing statistics to share regarding <u>ProStart</u>, one of our high school workforce programs!

- **By the numbers:** Despite not adding to our total number of ProStart programs offered in Minnesota throughout 2024, our 69 existing programs enrolled over 2,200(!) more students this year compared to last year!
- **That's not all:** Since 2022, we have more than DOUBLED the number of students enrolled in our ProStart Programs across the state, with each program enrolling on average 188 students. Now, nearly 13,000 students across the state are enrolled in ProStart, just one of our several workforce development programs!

Why it matters: The future of our hospitality industry depends on a highly trained workforce to continue to provide world-class service across Minnesota. Programs like ProStart are making that future possible.

• **Yes and:** Thanks to intel provided to HMEF, our ProStart instructors have confirmed that over 2,000 of our current 13,000 ProStart students are already working in the industry.

• We're only getting started: Our partners at CAPI USA are about to graduate two more Restaurant Ready participants later this month!

What is Restaurant Ready? For those unfamiliar, Restaurant Ready is a national program dedicated to helping people acquire the basic job and life skills necessary to pursue jobs in the restaurant and hospitality industry and jumpstart a pathway to independence.

How it works:

- **Community-Based Organizations** (CBOs) partner with the National Restaurant Association Education Foundation (NRAEF) and their State Restaurant Association (SRAs) to provide training in six work-ready competency areas defined by the hospitality industry. These competencies are designed to help participants acquire the skills, discipline, and confidence to start a job and stay employed.
- The State Restaurant Association links individuals to local employers and community-based organizations provide wraparound services to eliminate any barriers to success.

Restaurant Ready Program Goals

- Establish the hospitality industry as a suitable place for first jobs, and as a model of employment, development and advancement.
- Foster collaboration between community organizations, state restaurant associations, and employers to help get your open entry-level positions filled with quality employees.

What happened: Over the last couple of weeks, states legislators from Shakopee, Burnsville, and Minneapolis visited some of our ProStart schools to see up close how the program works, how the hospitality industry benefits from it, and what the enrolled students are learning thanks to its curriculum.

- **Greater Minnesota, get ready!** In the coming weeks we'll also be visiting ProStart programs in Duluth and Mankato with elected officials.
- Why it matters: This year, the Association will be advocating for more ProStart funding during the state's legislative session in Saint Paul. Impactful legislator visits are a critical aspect to getting our funding requests across the finish line.
