The House reached a <u>power sharing agreement</u> late Wednesday bringing the DFL House members back to the Capitol. Over in the Senate, the power sharing agreement reached prior to session has ended following the swearing in of Sen. Doron Clark (DFL) in District 60.

This week I am breaking down what is included in the House power sharing agreement, what the Senate has been up to this week, and sharing resources on ICE raids.

Session Snapshot



Stay informed: The House power sharing agreement was finally reached on Wednesday night, following the DFL's boycott of session for the last month. After court cases, dueling press conferences, and sparing of words publicly, the House looks set to get back to business as usual at the legislature.

Why it matters: The full agreement, passed as a resolution yesterday during the House floor session, details how the House will operate over the next two years under a tied DFL-GOP make up. The resolution lays out the committees and how they are structured, what the major finance and revenue bills will be, and how conference committees will be staffed and structured.

Go deeper: Here are the key points of the full agreement:

- Rep. Demuth R-Cold Springs will be Speaker of the House for the 2025-26 biennium, making her the first female Republican and first Black person to hold the position
- Republicans will hold the chair positions of all committees until the special election for district 40B takes place on March 11
- Democrats and Republicans will co-chair all committees following the March 11 special election
- -
- A new committee, the Fraud Prevention and State Agency Oversight Policy, will consist of 5 Republican and 3 Democrat representatives
- A House Ethics Committee will hold a hearing on election contests and how to handle them, with a rule added that 68 votes are needed to recall any member of the House

The big picture: Over in the Senate, committees have been moving forward in a business-as-usual fashion.

- This week, the state's tourism agency, Explore Minnesota, presented their 2024 progress and goals for 2025 based on the Governor's proposed budget.
- The presentation included information on investments in outdoor recreation and marketing strategies to make Minnesota the premier outdoor recreation destination.

One fun thing: Over in the Senate, HM's ProStart Funding appropriation was introduced this week. SF 663 would appropriate \$500,000 to our Education Foundation for our ProStart programming. To find out more about ProStart, check out HM's <u>website</u>!
