**Go deeper:** The bipartisan bill includes <u>several provisions that will</u> benefit the hospitality industry. Below are highlights of what is in the bill: • An extension of the 100% bonus depreciation through the end of 2025. Under current law, leasehold and other qualifying interior improvements are eligible for bonus depreciation. In 2026, bonus depreciation would fall to 20% and expire after 2026. • A retroactive, four-year extension of the taxpayer-favorable earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation, and amortization (EBITDA) standard for measuring the amount of business interest deductible under section 163(j). • A provision accelerating the deadline to file claims for the
